Meeting opened at 7.30pm.

1) Apologies: Amanda Chuter, Chris Palmer, Bryan Bartlett and Jim Godfrey

2) <u>Declarations of Interest on agenda items:</u> None. The meeting was confirmed as Quarate.

3) Open Discussion: Keri Phillips was introduced and spoke about the mill. The house was connected via a curtilage. The walls were separating in the cottage so that it could not be lived in. The house was to have a major refurbishment over the next 12 months. The windmill could not be opened as it was not deemed safe for voulunteers to use facilities in the cottage. The sail had come —off as a result of a previous repair failing. The trust were waiting for the insurance to mend the mill. It would take a long time to repair due to finding the craftsmen required and they would be Worthing under the recommendations of the conservation officer. All other work had been done in the mill so apart from the sail it was structurally sound. It was not possible to move up the list of priorities.

On a different matter once the ownership had been established of a strip of land by Teddy Bear Cottage it would be possible to write to the owners of the rough part of land which was thought to be harbouring vermin.

4) Councillors reports

Clare Aparicio Paul's report had been forwarded. It was noted that the Libraries consultation remained open until tomorrow.

5) <u>Approval of Minutes</u> - The minutes of the meeting held on 9th May 2018 were approved as a true record.

6) Planning Applications for Consideration

- a) 18/01622/FUL Hamdown Farm, Picts Hill, Langport TA10 9EX The formation of a replacement field entrance and the laying of a no-dig private pedestrian path. After discussion and listening to objections and the applicant it was unanimously agreed that the Parish Council should not make a determination/decision on the application due to civil legal issues surrounding the application which were not planning matters, thereby leaving the council unable to make a decision.
- b) 18/01075/FUL The Cottage, Picts Hill, Langport, TA10 9EX Erection of 2 no. dwellings with associated parking and turning, landscaping and gardens.- After discussion the application was unanimously supported.
- c) 18/01554/FUL Bramwells, Low Ham Road, Low Ham, Langport TA10 9DY Demolition of existing porch, alterations and the erection of a two storey extension to dwellinghouse. After discussion the application met with a unanimous vote of no objections.
- d) 18/01332/S73 Ark Farm, New manor House Road, High Ham, Langport TA10 9DP Application to vary planning conditions 2 (approved plans) 6 (access/visibility splays) 7 (existing access and 8 (materials of new wall) of approval 16/03242/FUL in order to change roadside boundary treatment. After discussion the application met with a unanimous vote of no objections.
- e) 18/01527/LBC Classeys Huse, Classeys House Road, High Ham TA10 9DP Conversion of a former stable and coachhouse to ancillary accommodation. Replacement of 2 no. fireplaces, insertion of door to existing opening and external repairs to house. Provision of new foul drainage system. After discussion the application met with a unanimous vote of no objections, but it was to be commented that it should be tied to the main house.



7) Planning Applications Decided

Department of Transport had granted the stopping up of the layby by Nenmead.

18/00710/FUL- Torwood - Demolition of cottages and the erection of 2 No. dwellings – Revised) – GRANTED 18/00642/FUL – The Meads, Henley – Proposed change of use of agricultural land to form garden extension, erection of a single storey rear extension, erection of a new double garage, enlargement of hard standing to front and internal alterations – GRANTED

18/00545/FUL – Orchard Home, Henley Road – Erection of a dry fodder store and creation of a new agricultural access.-GRANTED

17/03122/FUL – Land at High Ham, Hillside Farm Road – proposed creation of a new agricultural access.-GRANTED 18/01136/PDE – The Heights, Main Road - Permission not required.

8) Matters arising/Items for Discussion

a. Highways

Bryan Bartlett continued to work with the reporting of defects of highways to the Highways officer.

Fingerpost Restoration Project

Following training, survey of posts, and a lot of form-filling, the team started work in May by working on the part-painted Fingerpost at One Elm.

The post at Hext Hill has been scraped, primed and painted, and the surrounding vegetation removed that was obscuring the post.

The post at Henley/Windsor Farm has been released from the hedge, raised in height and primed. The finial and 1 arm are being restored off-site.

Hidden in a hedge at the bottom of Stout is a post and finial - the arms lost long ago. The plan is to use this redundant to replace the post on The Green.

There has been 4 sessions and a total of approx. 20 hours worked by the team: Dave Vigar, Roger Powell, Phil Cale, Amanda Chuter.

Thanks to Dave for the use of his tractor and trailer; Roger for his truck and the additional work done at home; to Jane for her refreshments; Bill for his 4 minutes of digging; the loan of a crowbar from a resident who came to look; and all the passing drivers and their calls of thanks.

- h. Other Parking by School it was agreed that individuals seeing bad parking should put pressure on the police to come and look. The care taker was to clear some brambles from the hedge over the next ½ term which would help with a few parking spaces.

District Councillor Report – Gerard Tucker reported on the District Council matters affecting High Ham. There was to be an Area North meeting for local councils on 26th June.

The dates of future meetings would be changing so that the District Councillor could attend meetings.
