3) Open Discussion : The Christmas Crew were congratulated on their charitable fund raising. The Lengthsman was to clear the pavement around the postbox on the green.

4) Councillors reports -

The District Councillor's report highlighted issues of rural crime and also some small grants available from various sources. There was to be a presentation at Compton Dundon Village Hall on the evening of 9th February for the local Parish Councils.

Derek's monthly report had been forwarded to the councillors. Problems with funding the care bill were highlighted. Additionally Derek would ask the Police and Crime Commissioner some questions about rural crime and livestock thefts at a meeting in Yeovil. Derek Yeomans left the meeting with his apologies at the conclusion of this item.

<u>5) Playing Field Plans</u> - The draft plans were reviewed and the Parish Council authorised the playing field committee to move ahead to the planning and consultation stage.

Millennium Wood:

2 new paths cleared in the middle copse as part of the Identification Trail - to be completed with ID Information Board in Spring.

Work started on chipping of brash. Some wood piles are being kept to be sold as income for MW. Craig and Roger Hall have selected and marked trees for felling to make room for new trees from the The tree whips given by Trust for Conservation Volunteers.

Cemetery:

Branches growing around cables, cleared.

Highways:

Collected and delivered de-icing supplies from Somerset Highways depot. 10 bags distributed between parish grit bins. THe Hext Hill bin full of water - holes drilled to empty.

Drainage:

Grips and grids cleared in Low Ham , including those on Hext Hill and Long St.

Planned work in January includes: to create seating for outdoor classroom in MW.

<u>Footpath Strimmer</u> No December activity. SCC have collected strimmer for servicing - awaiting return.

A new role, Volunteer and Trails Officer, has been added to the SCC Rights of Way Team - Tracy Sutton. She will be Tony Whitford's link to the team. Hopefully, this will result in further practical support for Tony in his work to improve our footpaths and increase their use.
