

# MINUTES OF HIGH HAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT HIGH HAM VILLAGE HALL ON TUESDAY 12<sup>th</sup> September 2017

Meeting opened at 7.30pm.

1) <u>Apologies</u>: Chris Palmer

**Declarations of Interest on agenda items** Amanda Chuter declared an interest in application 8c due to the applications location.

### 3) Open Discussion:

The Nat West community banker was present and spoke briefly regarding banking arrangements and a mobile service 12.30 every Thursday where cash pay-ins could be made. Information leaflets were left. It was advised that several Nat West bank services could be used at the Post Office, Langport although this did preclude business pay-ins. Meeting updated regarding the phone boxes – which would now be staying as functional phone boxes. Fault at Henley box had been fixed so that was serviceable.

Finger posts mentioned – ongoing School Parking issues raised again.

### 4) Councillors reports

Clare Aparicio Paul gave the **County Councillor's report.** Somerset Skills and Learning funding had been cut. A County OFSTED inspection was imminent. There were ongoing issues regarding the footpath order that deleted the disputed footpath. The ongoing issues were with reference to an agreement with a landowner for an alternative result and it looked very positive news for walkers that a variation of the old route would now be available.

Parish was to keep an eye on the impact of the Aller road closure. The issue regarding the dropping of the school curb may be suitable for a 'small scheme improvement', in which case the work could be done without cost to the Parish. Giga Clear broad band fibre to door was becoming available.

## **Gerard gave the District Councillor's report**

In July 2 applications in the Parish had gone to area north and been supported by the Parish and had been approved. The District Council boundary review was taking place. Gerard explained in more detail what was being asked of the Parish Council and it was felt that the Parish Council should consider the written information from the Boundary Commission that was being circulated and then make comments next month.

Funding for some business projects was available through the LEADER programme. Anyone interested should contact Gerard in the first instance.

<u>5) Approval of Minutes</u> - The minutes of the meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> August 2017 were approved as a true record.

## 6) Matters arising/Items for Discussion

### a. Highways

Aller road traffic to be monitored. Last closure resulted in unsustainable use of the Nythe Road with HGVs causing much damage. Traffic levels etc to be monitored and reported onward s to Highways as appropriate. The Woodland Trust/National Trust/Somerset Wildlife were able to open land to divert the closed footpath. It was thought that this would be a permissive path.

Links transport closure was discussed and situation to be monitored. There was likely to be some help initially for an alternative new scheme, but details were to be finalised.

NHS screening was to be pursued in conjunction with Pitney. Hopefully for a Saturday morning. Boundary review – the question for the Parish to answer was should the Turnhill boundary be reviewed – discuss at next meeting.

### 8) Planning Applications for Consideration

a) 17/03230/FUL 2 Hillside,Long Street,High Ham,Langport,Somerset,TA10 9DN, Demolish existing rear extension and erect a two storey rear extension to the dwellinghouse After discussion it was voted 4 in favour, 2 against to support the application.



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- b) 17/03387/FUL Well Cottage ,Hillside Farm Road,High Ham,Langport,TA10 9DB Conversion of stand alone garage in rear garden of property into residential accommodation. Unanimously agreed insufficient information to support the application.
- c) 17/03122/FUL Land At High Ham ,Hillside Farm Road,High Ham,Langport,TA10 9BD Proposed formation of a hardstanding and creation of a new agricultural access. Amanda Chuter having declared an interest in the application was allowed to speak from the audience and then left the meeting before further discussion. After discussion it was voted 4 objections to the application and one abstention. The objection being regarding the hardstanding rather than the creation of the access. Amanda Chuter rejoined the meeting at the conclusion of this item.

d)17/03075/COU Land OS 0012, Henley, Langport, Somerset,, Change of use of land and formation of car park. After discussion all councillors were in favour but were in agreement with the conservation officers suggestion to rotate car park by 90 degrees.
